Course Description for P-French I (35101/2)

DEPARTMENT: World Language

GRADE: Open to all grades

LENGTH: One year

CREDITS: 10 (Ten)

PREREQUISITE: None

COURSE DESCRIPTION: French I practices skills of listening, speaking, reading, writing, and cultural

understanding. Students who have had French for a full year in middle school may take a proficiency test and, if successful passing it, may enter French II as

a 9th grader.

EXIT CRITERIA: By the end of the school year, students are expected to do the following:

Listening Skills

- 1. Can comprehend simple statements and questions and usually the main idea of longer but simple messages and conversations.
- 2. Can hear and distinguish between different patterns of intonation and stress.
- 3. Can understand and respond to simple directions given in the target language.
- 4. Can understand simple dialogues and stories.
- 5. Can demonstrate an understanding of basic facts and sequence of events in more complex stories and dialogues, although repetition may be required.

Speaking Skills

- 1. Can initiate and respond to simple statements.
- 2. Can manage simple face to face conversations within the vocabulary, structure, phonology, and functions appropriate to the communicative situations in the target language.
- 3. Can describe simple situations in the target language.
- 4. Can deliver a brief narrative in the target language.
- 5. Can be understood by native speakers used to foreigners attempting to speak their language with some repetitions and circumlocution.

Reading Skills

- 1. Can read and understand simple connected material for informative or social purposes.
- 2. Can understand the context of material of public statements and standardized messages.
- 3. Can comprehend the main idea of materials containing simple structure and syntax, with the help of visual cues and prior familiarity with the topic.

Course Description for P-French I (35101/2)

Writing Skills

- 1. Can express basic personal needs.
- 2. Can compose short messages on very familiar topics based on personal experience.
- 3. Can recombine learned vocabulary on structures in simple sentences.
- 4. Can show acceptable control of basic constructions and can express present, past and future ideas using conventional words and time expressions.
- 5. Can be understood by native speakers used to dealing with foreigners.

Cultural Understanding

- 1. Can recognize and reproduce gestures peculiar to the target language.
- 2. Has knowledge of some aspects of target language culture.
- 3. Is aware of existence of cultures other than his/her own.
- 4. Can function in authentic common everyday situations, but makes frequent cultural errors, which may impede communication by one with native speakers accustomed to dealing with foreigners?
